

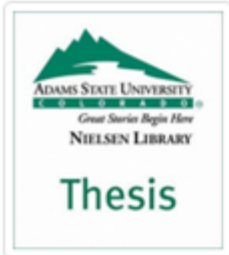

## Three Wire Winter Oral History and Magazine Collection

Between 1976 and 1988 Steamboat Springs High School students captured the oral histories of prominent Routt County citizens and published them in a magazine titled Three Wire Winter. Twenty-four issues went to press before the program ended and the collection was deeded to the Tread of Pioneers Museum. In 2015, the Bud Werner Memorial Library and the Tread of Pioneers Museum partnered to feature Three Wire Winter and its wealth of oral history interviews, magazine articles, photos and other documents through the library's catalog.

**Description**

Charles Baker's group of prospectors found traces of placer gold in the [San Juan Mountains](#) in 1860 at [Eureka, Colorado](#). Forced out by the Ute Tribe in 1861, who had been awarded the area in a US treaty. The prospectors returned in 1871, when lode gold was found in the Little Giant vein at [Arrastre Gulch](#). The miners were allowed to stay after the [Brunot Treaty](#) of 13 Sept. 1873. In exchange for giving up 4 million acres, the [Southern Ute Indian Reservation](#) received \$25,000 per year.

In August 1873, [George Howard](#) and [R.J. McClint](#) discovered the [Sunnyside silver vein](#) along [Hurricane Peak](#). Gold was then discovered in 1882. The [Sunnyside Mine](#) was shut down after the 1929 [stock market crash](#), but was acquired by [Standard Metals Corp.](#) in 1959, and reopened, finding gold in 1973 with the [Little Mary vein](#). Half of Colorado's gold production in the 1970s came from the [Sunnyside](#). Disaster occurred on 4 June 1978, when the water from [Lake Emma](#) collapsed a mine shaft (when miners weren't present) and then traveled quickly through the tunnels, shooting out a portal along [Cement Creek](#) with a force that toppled a 20-ton locomotive. The mine reopened after two years, but was acquired by [Echo Bay Mines](#) in 1986, which operated the mine for another five years. The nearby [Gold King mine](#) breached and spilled into [Cement Creek](#), causing the 2015 [Gold King Mine waste water spill](#).

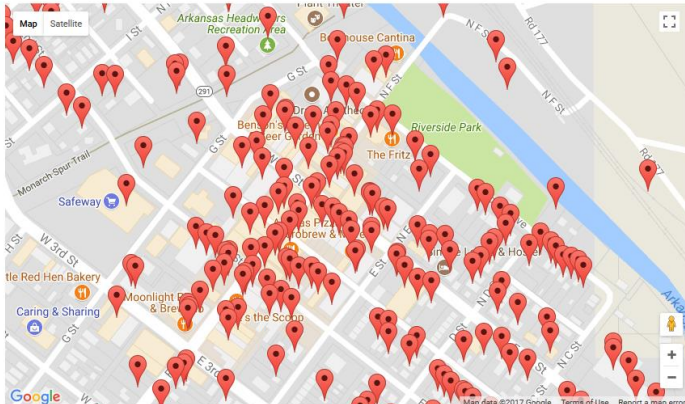



### Marmot Launches Digital Archive

Marmot Library Network, the multi-type consortium based in Grand Junction, CO, has developed a Digital Archive and repository solution, enabling its member libraries to showcase digitized collections of images, postcards, books, magazines, videos, recorded oral histories and music, academic research, and more.



Using Islandora for administration, and Marmot's own Pika resource portal and discovery layer (a fork of VuFind), the new solution is designed to surface archive content alongside related books, ebooks, DVDs, and other content when patrons conduct searches of their library's catalog. Member libraries can also create custom online exhibits to highlight specific collections. Online exhibits began launching in August 2016, and this spring Marmot released an update enabling libraries to share combined collections of related archive content throughout the network.

"Each Marmot library can maintain ownership (and limit access, as appropriate) of any collection, but the whole collection is a regional resource where persons, places, and events that appear in multiple collections are linked," explained Jimmy Thomas, Marmot's executive director. "A clean
